

SYNTHETIC SAMPLE: DEPOSITION ERRATA TRANSCRIPTION CHECK

Errata transcription check: cover

Rule text: "30 days after being notified by the officer that the transcript or recording is available" to review it and, "if there are changes in form or substance, to sign a statement listing the changes and the reasons for making them." (FRCP 30(e)(1).) Whether a state rule, stipulation or method of service changes the count is a question for counsel.

What was checked

All 180 pages, line by line, against the produced records (EXMC000001 to EXMC000020) and the factual paragraphs of the report served June 30, 2026. The check looks only for words and figures the transcript prints differently from a document: drug names, doses, Apgar scores, dates, lab values, measurements, Bates numbers and proper names.

What came back

The workbook (SYNTHETIC - Errata Transcription Check - Dr. A. Example.xlsx) lists each candidate with its page and line, the text as printed, the record and report passages quoted with links to the page, and a blank column for the expert's decision. A second tab gives the records' spelling of every proper noun and clinical term, with any variant the transcript prints.

What this check does not do

It never suggests clarifying, adding to or changing an answer, never flags an answer because it differs from the report, and gives no view on whether any change is permitted. Opinion testimony is not compared with anything. The expert decides each candidate, completes the reporter's errata sheet, states the reasons and signs it. Only words and figures that a document states can be checked, so the expert should still read the full transcript.
